



# Banksia Walkabout KWG

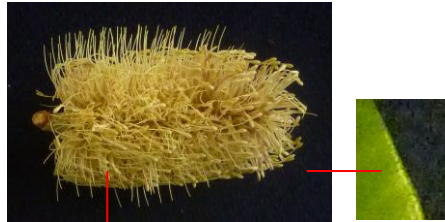

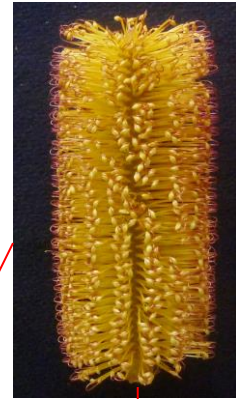

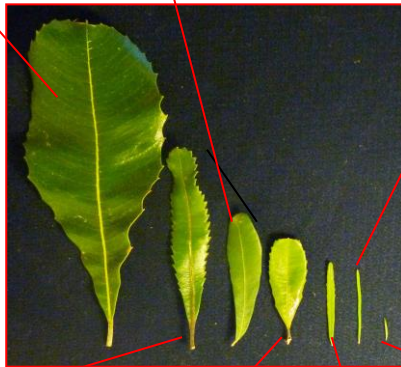
***Banksia robur*:**  
“Swamp Banksia”  
Large, glossy leaves



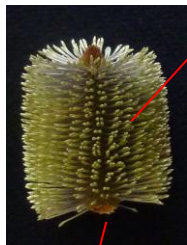
***Banksia integrifolia*:**  
“Coastal Banksia”  
Leaf edges smooth, not serrated



***Banksia spinulosa*:**  
“Hair-pin Banksia”  
Few serrations on leaf tips



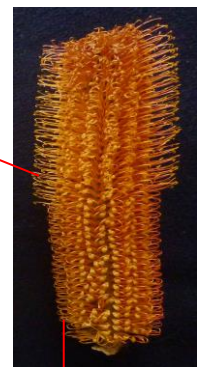
***Banksia serrata*:**  
“Old Man Banksia”  
Serrated leaves;  
knobbly bark on old trees



***Banksia oblongifolia*:**  
Leaves serrated and  
oblong; undersurface  
brown and velvety



***Banksia marginata*:**  
“Silver Banksia”  
Slightly serrated  
leaves



***Banksia ericifolia*:**  
“Heath-leaved Banksia”  
Large, orange spikes;  
tiny leaves
