

RAINFOREST Walkabout KWG

Rainforest in Australia is only a fraction of that found many million years ago. Since that time most of Australia has substantially dried out and rainforest remains only in parts. Remnant areas include the Daintree forests, parts of Tasmania and smaller parts on or near the Eastern coast. In Sydney rainforest is only found in moist sheltered valleys and this is the case at the Wildflower Garden. However a range of species has been planted around Caley's Pavilion.

The most common means of identification possibly is by features of their leaves. The fruits can be quite spectacular and are often edible, if not by people then by other species, especially birds.
